Fort Collins, CO –Poudre Fire Authority responded this afternoon to a report of smoke filling a house at the above stated address. The first due engine company found a split-level, wood-framed, single-family residence with smoke showing from the exterior. Upon further investigation firefighters found a large amount of fire inside the living area on the main level, and the exterior in the rear of the residence. Firefighters immediately launched an aggressive interior attack along with a primary search for possible trapped occupants. Searches for occupants were negative, however two dogs and one cat was found deceased.

Crews also performed tasks such as ventilation through the roof. This however was not completed due to the large amount of fire in the attic space which is very unsafe for firefighters because of the collapse potential.

It is unclear at this time how and why the one occupant suffered smoke inhalation injuries. This person was not transported.

The kitchen, living room, upstairs and attic area suffered heavy fire damage. The remaining areas of the house suffered significant heat and/or smoke damage.

Red Cross responded to assist the occupants with immediate food, clothing and shelter needs.

The origin and cause is currently under investigation.
