Fort Collins, CO – Poudre Emergency Communications Center received 911 calls about a building on fire with flames and small explosions in the area of County Road 54G and North Overland Trail, northeast of Fort Collins. The first callers could not give an exact address so firefighters had to search for the location. The location of the residence has many trees and it was snowing heavily at the time which made locating this fire a challenge.

Firefighters arrived to find a large amount of smoke coming from a two-story, historic log cabin with a one-story, single-family, wood-framed dwelling attached. The entire building however was two separate occupancies. They also found that the one occupant of the cabin was not home and the one occupant of the attached residence had already safely escaped.

Firefighters initiated an aggressive interior attack on the fire in an attempt to keep it from spreading into the additional attached residence and other living spaces. Crews were successful with this; however the fire also spread to the attic and the many void spaces in this old building which made control difficult. During the firefight there was a partial roof collapse over an added-on portion of the residence. The building also suffered heavy fire, smoke and water damage.

Two people, one civilian and one firefighter, were injured after they slipped on the ice. Both were taken to a local hospital with unspecified injuries.

The origin and cause is currently under investigation.
