Fort Collins, CO – Poudre Fire Authority responded today to a reported small grass fire in a field. When the first engine arrived on scene they found the fire spreading towards homes to the north and west with the help of a light wind. Additional units were immediately requested for structure protection. At one point eight homes were threatened. Firefighters were able to keep the fire from all the structures with the exception of one detached garage that sustained damage to siding. The fire is estimated at 30 acres. Crews will remain on scene for most of the evening.

Poudre Fire Authority investigators are currently investigating the origin and cause. No additional information is available at this time regarding the investigation.

Poudre Fire Authority would like to remind everyone that conditions are ripe for vegetation fires to spread quickly. Please be careful using any fire and remember to adhere to the current burn restrictions.

Assisting agencies: Colorado State Patrol, Fort Collins Police Services, Larimer County Sheriff's Office & Emergency Services and Poudre Valley Hospital Ambulance Service. Two empty PFA stations were covered by Loveland Fire/Rescue and Wellington Fire Protection District.
