House fire in south Fort Collins displaces Family

Fort Collins, CO – Poudre Fire Authority fire crews battled snowy conditions and cold temperatures while fighting a two alarm house fire overnight that displaced a family in south Fort Collins. A neighbor alerted the residents of the fire and they were able to escape without injury. When firefighters arrived, they found the garage, an RV and several other vehicles fully involved. The fire was reported around midnight and brought under control within 30 minutes.

The residents of the home will not be able to return to their home for some time due to the heavy damage caused by the blaze. One firefighter was taken to the hospital with injuries sustained from a fall due to the icy conditions. The firefighter was treated at Poudre Valley Hospital and released early this morning. The cause of the fire remains under investigation and fire investigators will return to the scene today to continue their work.
