Fort Collins, CO- Firefighters responded this afternoon to a reported bush on fire, spreading to a duplex apartment. The first engine arrived to find a one-story, wood-frame building with fire on the exterior that was being extinguished by civilians. However, the fire had already spread into the residence through a window, and attic area. Firefighters were able to quickly extinguish the remaining fire in the living space and attic, thereby halting further damage to the fire unit and save the entire unit next door. The involved unit suffered fire damage on the exterior, very limited fire damage to the interior and smoke damage throughout.

Three residents have been displaced by this fire. Red Cross responded to assist them with immediate food, clothing and housing needs.

PFA and LCSO Investigators have determined the origin to be around a juniper bush in front of the residence. The cause has been determined to be misuse of a legal type of firework. This particular firework is legal within certain areas of unincorporated Larimer County, however no fireworks are legal to use or even possess with the City of Fort Collins. No additional information is available at this time.

Assisting agencies are Larimer County Sheriff's Office, Larimer Humane Society, Poudre Valley Ambulance Service and Northern Colorado Red Cross.
