Fort Collins, CO – A resident and two dogs escaped their duplex after a fire was discovered in an upstairs family room. PFA firefighters arrived to find a two-story, wood-frame duplex with smoke showing from a rear window on the second floor. Firefighters acted quickly to extinguish the flames while holding fire spread to one room. Searches for any occupants possibly still inside proved negative. Firefighters also ventilated heat, smoke and fire gases from the residence and confirmed there was no additional fire spread.

Fire damage was limited to the one room; however there was additional heat and smoke damage throughout the residence.

The fire origin was determined to be in an upstairs family room. The cause was determined to be accidental; electrical malfunction involving a floor lamp.
