Fort Collins, CO- Firefighters responded just before 0930 hours this morning to the report of a large tank that had fallen off a truck and was leaking some type of foaming liquid in a westbound lane of East Mulberry St. Crews arrived on scene including a Hazardous Materials Unit to find an approximate 225 gallon tank with an unknown type of liquid. Firefighters cordoned off the area and attempted to determine the type of product. Crews estimated approximately 115 gallons had spilled. After conducting numerous tests and samplings monitors showed that the product was mildly toxic and posed no significant threat to the public and environment.

The liquid was transferred to 55-gallon containers and prepared for disposal. Colorado Department of Transportation will have a hazardous materials remediation company complete the clean up and disposal work.

During the incident portions of Mulberry Street and the northbound on-ramp to I-25 from eastbound Mulberry were closed as a precaution. Mulberry Street was fully reopened shortly after 1:00 p.m.
